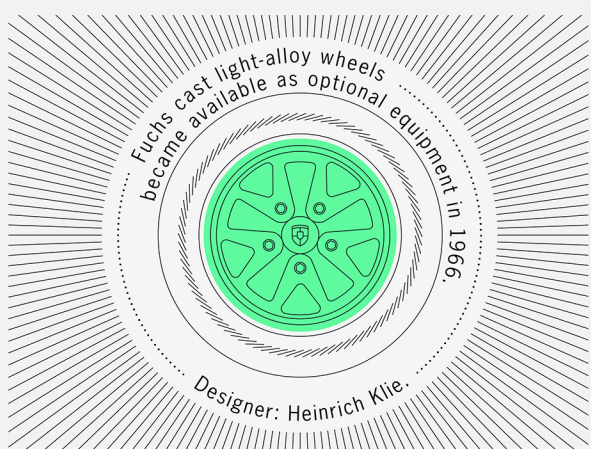
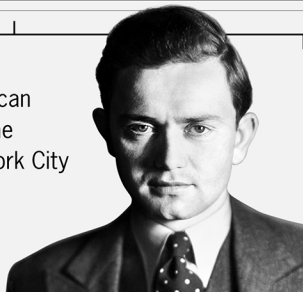

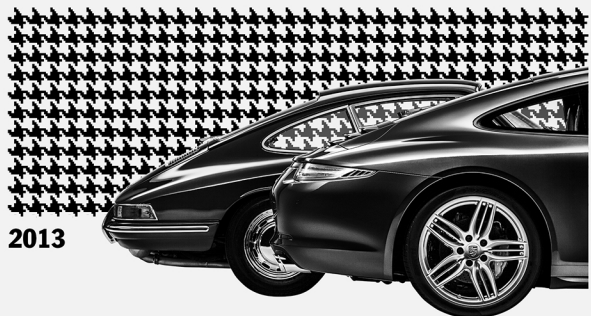


911 Turbo #1

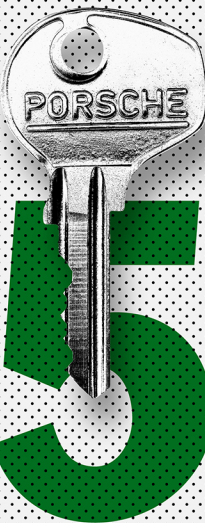

With a top speed of **225 km/h**, the 911 S is the fastest German production car in 1966.

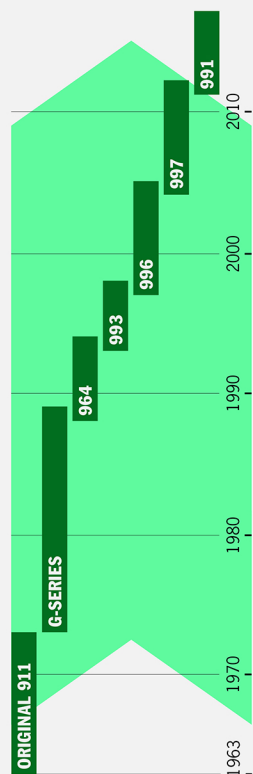

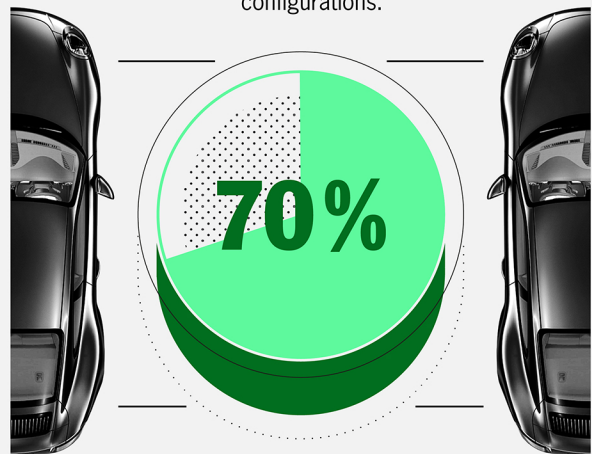
