MATCH NOTES – QUARTERFINALS – FRIDAY, APRIL 19

[1] Iga Swiatek (POL #1) vs [WC] Emma Raducanu (GBR #303)

Swiatek leads 2-0

Swiatek is bidding to become the first three-peat champion in Stuttgart since Maria Sharapova (2012-14)... **Swiatek** is atop the WTA rankings for the 99th week of her career... **Swiatek** has lost only three matches on clay in the last three years, posting a 38-3 record during that stretch... This is **Raducanu's** third time meeting the reigning WTA World No.1... Currently ranked No.303, Raducanu is the lowest-ranked player to reach a WTA 500 quarterfinal since 2018 St. Petersburg (No.450 Rybakina, QF)... **Raducanu** is projected to move inside the Top 230 by reaching the QF and could move into the Top 180 with a win today...

[2] Aryna Sabalenka (#2) vs. [6] Marketa Vondrousova (CZE #8)

Sabalenka leads 4-2

This is **Vondrousova's** first Stuttgart QF, bettering two R16 efforts... **Sabalenka** has reached the final on all her three Stuttgart appearances, and is therefore through to her fourth consecutive QF here... **Sabalenka's** three final losses all came to the reigning WTA World No.1 (Barty then two losses to Swiatek)... **Vondrousova** is through to her second QF of the season (after Dubai) and bidding to reach first SF since winning Wimbledon last season... This is **Sabalenka's** third QF of 2024, after Brisbane (R-Up) and the Australian Open (WON)... **Vondrousova** is looking for her first Top 10 win since defeating No.4 Pegula at 2023 Wimbledon en route to the title...

[4] Elena Rybakina (KAZ #4) vs. Jasmine Paolini (ITA #14)

Series tied 1-1

Rybakina is through to her first Stuttgart QF, bettering two 2r efforts in 2022 and 2023... **Rybakina** is through to a Tourleading seventh QF this season having played eight events in 2024 – only tournament she didn't reach this stage or better was Australian Open (2r)... **Paolini** is seeking her fifth win over a Top 10 player, and having defeated No.9 Jabeur in R16, and is bidding for mulitple Top 10 wins at the same event for the first time... **Paolini** will reach a career-high of World No.13 after this week... **Rybakina** leads the Tour in aces (190) and is 6-1 vs. Top 20 opponents; only Swiatek (8) has more Top 20 wins this year...


[3] Coco Gauff (USA #3) vs. Marta Kostyuk (UKR #27)

Gauff leads 2-0

Gauff is the first American woman to reach the Stuttgart QF since 2018 (Vandeweghe, R-Up)... **Gauff** is the youngest American to reach the QF at this tournament since 1998 (Serena Williams, QF at Filderstadt at 17 years old)... **Kostyuk** is through to her fifth quarterfinal of the season after Adelaide, Australian Open, San Diego, and Indian Wells... **Kostyuk** is seeking her sixth Top 10 win and second in a row after defeating No.7 Zheng Qinwen in R16 (also saved match points) ... Both players are through to the Stuttgart QFs for the first time...



- Bidding to become the first three-peat champion in Stuttgart since Maria Sharapova (2012-14)
- After 1r bye, defeated Elise Mertens to reach 5th QF of 2024 (including United Cup)
- Faces No.303 Emma Raducanu in QF today; on clay, Swiatek has won 37 of last 38 matches vs players ranked outside the Top 20
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 28-5 (9-3 in QF on clay)
- Owns 4-0 career record against players from United Kingdom
- Owns 7-3 career record against wildcards
- Owns 7 clay-court titles; among active players, only Venus Williams (9) and Simona Halep (9) have won more clay-court titles (Sara Errani has also won 7)
- Is No. 1 seed this week; has been top seed at 32 tournaments in her career; the No.1 seed has won the title here 20 times
- Is currently ranked No.1; this time last year was ranked No.1; this week marks 99th career week at No.1
- During last year's European Clay swing Won title at Stuttgart, finished runner at Madrid and Roland Garros; reached QF at Rome
- Longest winning streak of her career was 37 matches in 2022
- Tied for the Tour-lead with 23 match wins so far in 2024

- Faces WTA World No.1 Iga Swiatek in QF today; this is her third meeting against a reigning WTA World No.1; lost previous two meetings with Swiatek - 2022 Stuttgart and 2023 Indian Wells
- Last Brit to defeat a World No.1 was Jo Konta at 2017 Eastborune (d. Kerber)
- Owns 2-2 career record against players from Poland
- Through to the QF stage of a Tour-level tournament for the 6th time (2nd time on clay, 2022 Stuttgart)
- Owns 6-11 career record against seeds, with a record in 2024 standing at 1-3
- Record in WTA QF matches stands at 2-3
- Twice has a wildcard won the title at this tournament: Laura Siegemund in 2017, Justine Henin in 2010
- Is currently ranked No.303; this time last year was ranked No.68
- Ranked No.303. is lowest ranked player to reach a WTA 500 QF since No.450 Elena Rybakina (2018 St. Petersburg QF); with a win, she would be the lowest ranked player to reach the SF at a WTA 500 tournament since 2017 Stuttgart (Sharapova, NR)



CAREER MILESTONES

- Won six titles across 2023, including winning fourth Grand Slam title at Roland-Garros (d. Muchova in F) and going undefeated at the WTA Finals in Cancun (d. Pegula in F). Finished season as WTA World No.1 player for second consecutive year.
- In 2022, lifted second and third Grand Slam titles, at Roland-Garros (d. Gauff in F) and US Open (d. Jabeur in F)
- Triumph in Paris was the last of six straight titles during 37-match winning streak - jointlongest unbeaten run on Tour since 1990
- Won two titles in 2021, at Adelaide and Rome.
 Other highlights included QF at Roland-Garros and SF at Ostrava and qualifying for WTA Finals Guadalajara (fell in group stage)
- Also finished doubles R-Up at 2021 Roland-Garros (w/Mattek-Sands, l. Krejcikova/Siniakova)
- Won her maiden Tour-level title at 2020 Roland-Garros without dropping a set, becoming the first player from Poland man or woman to win a Grand Slam singles title and first from her country to reach a major final since
 A.Radwanska at 2012 Wimbledon
- Ranked No.54, she became the lowest-ranked woman to win the Roland-Garros title in the Open Era and the lowest-ranked finalist since 1977 (No.56 Mihai). At 19y 132d, is the youngest champion in Paris since Monica Seles (18y 187d) in 1992
- Also became the first player to win her debut Tour-level title at a Grand Slam since Jelena Ostapenko at 2017 Roland-Garros
- Won WTA Most Improved Player of the Year for 2020, as voted on by members of the media.
 Also won the 2020 WTA Fan Favorite Award
- Ended 2019 season ranked No.61 after a campaign highlighted by R-Up finish at Lugano (l. Hercog) and R16 run at Roland-Garros (l. Halep). That year also reached 3r at Toronto (l. Osaka) and made 2r five times (incl. Australian and US Open)
- Broke into Top 100 at No.88 after R-Up finish at 2019 Lugano
- Made WTA qualifying debut at 2019 Auckland
- Ended 2018 season ranked No.175 (up from No.690 in 2017), after posting 42-6 record and winning four titles on ITF Circuit
- Member of Poland's Billie Jean King Cup team, 2018-20, 2021-22
- On professional debut, came through qualifying to win title at \$10k ITF/Stockholm-SWE in 2016; owns seven singles titles at this level

- In 2023 made fourth round of Indian Wells (I. Swiatek) before falling in opening rounds at Miami and Stuttgart. Ended her season after Stuttgart and took time away to undergo minor surgery on both hands and ankle in May 2023.
- Struggled with injuries and form throughout 2022 dropping as low as No.83 after 1r exit at US Open
- Best performance came late in the year with SF run in Seoul (l. Ostapenko via ret. w/left glute injury). Also made QF at Stuttgart (l. eventual champion Swiatek) and Washington DC (l. eventual champion Samsonova) with best winby-ranking coming over No.22 Azarenka during 3r run at Cincinnati
- Earned a career best year in 2021 jumping over 300 ranking spots and finishing the season inside the Top 20 at a career high of No.19 earning her the 2021 WTA Newcomer of the Year Award
- Reached QF at Cluj-Napoca 2 (l. Kostyuk) and made appearances at Indian Wells and Linz
- Won the US Open in only her fourth Tour-level appearance (d. fellow teenager Fernandez in F); did not drop a set and upset No.12 Bencic and No.18 Sakkari along the way to become the first qualifier to lift a Grand Slam title
- Fell 1r at San Jose (as WC, l. Zhang) and finished R-Up at WTA 125K Series event in Chicago (l. Tauson)
- At Wimbledon, became the youngest British woman in the Open Era to reach R16 (l. Tomljanovic via ret.); upset Top-50 players Vondrousova and Cirstea en route
- Made debut WTA main draw appearance at 2021 Nottingham (as WC, l. Dart in 1r)
- Ended 2020 by finishing R-Up at \$25k ITF/Sunderland-GBR
- Won title at \$25k ITF/Pune-IND in 2019
- Lifted first two ITF Circuit titles in 2018, at \$15k
 ITF/Antalya-TUR and \$15k ITF/Tiberias-GRE
- · Owns three singles titles on ITF Circuit
- In Juniors she reached back-to-back quarter finals of Wimbledon and US Open in 2018

 Enjoyed stellar junior career, including winning girls' singles at 2018 Wimbledon (d. Küng in F) and leading Poland to Junior Fed Cup in 2016



- Father is former Olympic rower Tomasz Swiatek, who competed in the men's quadruple sculls event at the 1988 Summer Olympics in Seoul
- In summer 2022 organised 'Iga Swiatek and friends for Ukraine' event in Krakow, which featured a mixed doubles match between Agnieszka Radwanska, Sergiy Stakhovsky, Polish junior Martyn Pawelski and herself, and was attended by Poland's First Lady, Agata Kornhauser-Duda, Elina Svitolina and Andriy Shevchenko. The occasion was watched by almost 15,000 people live and a further one million on television, raising more than half a million Euros for Ukrainian children and teenagers affected by the war
- Started playing tennis because her older sister was playing and wanted to beat her
- Enjoys rock music, including AC/DC and Pink Floyd
- Includes PZU, On, Tecnifibre, Rolex and Xiaomi in her endorsement portfolio

- Currently working with Nick Cavaday
- Only child, parents are Ian (Romanian) and Renee (Chinese). Born in Toronto and moved to Bromley, south of London, at the age of two
- Favorite shot is forehand and favorite surface is hard
- Started playing tennis aged five
- In the summer of 2021, completed her A-level exams in maths and English
- Has a wide variety of interests in sports such as go-karting, horse riding, tap dancing, golf, skiing and basketball
